Tena Koe,

I wish to lodge an interest in Wai 2358 for Te Atiawa Iwi.

The National Freshwater and Geothermal Resources Inquiry.

I wish to be registered as an interested party for/in the second stage of the claim.

I am disappointed that there is no internal claims database cross referencing management system to identify existing registered claims as similar or identical (Wai740).

I am of Maori descent. My ancestor was known as Mata te Naihi, Mata te Naehe or Te Wai Naihi, and she was related to the Te Atiawa Chief Te Whiti.

Mata and her family were living in and around the Rohe of Whanganui-A-Tara from 1839 to 1858.

My interest arises because I am the principal claimant of Wai 740 (attached/enclosed), which contains contemporary generic water claims for Te Atiawa Iwi and also because I am an elected trustee representative for Te Upoko O Te Ika within the Te Kahui Rongoa Trust.

Wai 740 make many references to freshwater being: Purposes 2.a,b,e,f,g, Recommendations 3.1,2,7,10,14.20,38, Conclusion "including freshwater and seawater rights (trading onshore and offshore), wind and water electricity generation etc".

Other references to "freshwater" also in this paragraph.

The Te Kahui Rongoa Trust is the sole national Rongoa Maori organisation representing 90%+ of all Iwi in New Zealand and which refers to water in the context of Rongoa Maori in the trust deed. References page1.C+D, + page 3 (a) (attached/enclosed).

I ask to receive two copies of the Wai 2358 file/relevant documents and the list of the 101 claimants/interested parties, so as to determine if the context of this claim incorporates aspects of Wai 740 and the Te Kahui Rongoa Trust Deed and if so, to therefore participate in the second stage of the claim.
